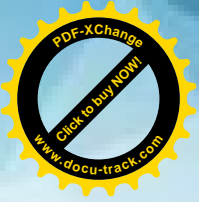

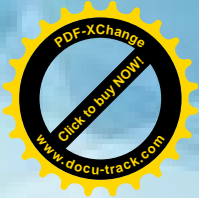
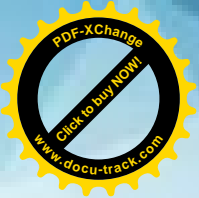
Guide for young people

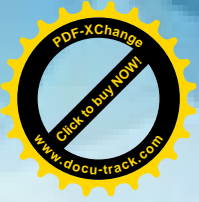

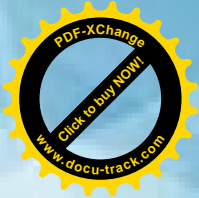
